The study will provide an analysis of human factors impacting nursing staff, reporting workflows and clinical outcomes in actual cases.

ATLANTA and NEW HAVEN, Conn., Feb. 5, 2025 /PRNewswire/ -- Acuity Behavioral Health, creators of the BHAI (Behavioral Health Acuity Index), a quantitative model for patient acuity and workload measurement for behavioral healthcare, today announced that Yale New Haven is implementing the BHAI in collaboration with the YNHH Center for Health Care Innovation to provide expanded clinical decision-support for YNHH's inpatient psychiatric and Emergency Department staffing and bed utilization needs for inpatient psychiatric facilities.

Concurrently, and in collaboration with several health systems currently utilizing the BHAI, this represents the next phase of an ongoing multi-institutional review of patient cases being conducted to further document the BHAI's impact on nursing staff workflows, staff allocations, patient care and

outcomes. An independent Human Factors Engineering analysis will correlate the BHAI's patient and unit-level acuity scoring with nursing staff time allocations and level of care for their inpatient psychiatric units. The review will document the impact on operational efficiency, workload balancing and retention, readmissions, and patient experience.

The BHAI is a validated and quantitative data compilation model developed by many of the nation's most trusted behavioral health institutions and clinical experts to address operational problems within inpatient psychiatric setting created by a growing number of patients, a declining population of nurses and staff, and an increasingly acute shortage of inpatient psychiatric beds. "In creating the BHAI, patient acuity was considered as the top priority in determining the level of care each patient requires," according to Jim Szyperski, President & CEO of Acuity. The BHAI provides a transparent measurement of patient acuity score via a comprehensive model that weighs specific elements of a patient record in combination with real-time inputs provided by nursing staff. The result is a precision acuity score on a 1- 100 scale for the individual patient and an aggregated score for each psychiatric unit. Built directly into nurse and nurse manager workflows, this information provides quantifiable and actionable clinical decision-support to accurately and efficiently plan the next day's staffing and resource needs.

"Current BHAI users report improvements in streamlined admissions, a reduction is readmissions, and ease of use by nursing staff in their actual clinical operations," said Acuity's CEO Jim Szyperski. 
